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Who will I/we need to help?

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Make sure you have suitable identification to hand - One of these forms of identification will be needed by your flu friend to collect antiviral medication if you need it. Your flu friend will also need identification.

- Passport
- Full driving licence
- Paid utility bill (not less than 6 months)
- Building society / national savings book
- Cheque guarantee / credit card/debit card
- Cheque book
- Credit card statement (not older than 6 months)
- Council tax payment book
- Birth / marriage certificate
- Military ID
- Trade Union card
- Standard Acknowledgment letter (SLA) issued by Home Office for Asylum seekers
- Child benefit letter
- Parent held record (red book)
- NHS card
- Healthcare professional registration number and ID
- Pension/benefit book

If you require antiviral medication you will be told where your flu friend needs to go to collect it from.

If you think you may have flu, please stay at home and phone NHS Direct or your GP for advice. Please do not go to your GP practice or hospital A & E department.
