July 2015 minute:

The committee noted and endorsed the report of the delegation. It was agreed that the font should be placed somewhere that was above all liturgically appropriate, in order to encourage its use. The committee considered that in this case the east end of the nave would be appropriate. More research was encouraged into the history and significance of the organ, and the organ advisers should be consulted as a matter of priority. Subject to these comments the committee agreed to recommend the works in principle.

September 2021 minute:

- The DAC recommends that consideration is given to starting over with a clean slate starting with a realistic assessment of the available resources.
- The parish is encouraged to evaluate realistically whether the current proposals will meet their need now and into the future this could include considering whether it would be best to relocate to a new site.
- A space use analysis of both sites should be carried out to help to better understand how the existing spaces are used, what is needed for the future, to what extent the existing buildings can be used to meet these needs and how these spaces should be integrated.
- The parish is encouraged to approach the Buildings and Glebe department to discuss options for the St Paul's Centre in Prescott Avenue.
- For the project to be viable, it is important to regain momentum and generate renewed enthusiasm amongst members of the congregation and local community. Phasing the project to allow physical progress to be seen would be a positive step.

Nov 2019 Minute:

The rebuilt Victorian church at Akeley was, sadly, demolished in 1979 owing to structural defects, a course of action which had strong pastoral ramifications which continue to be felt. The churchyard with graves and foundations of the church remaining, is in the centre of the village but without any spiritual focal point, is a void. The DAC has been aware for some time of the Parish's aspirations to create a structure in which small-scale worship and events can take place, to replace the spiritual focus lost with the demolition, and plans have been drawn up for a diminutive timber framed and glazed structure which will be situated in the chancel footprint of the old church. The timber framed and partially glazed inner walls would be surrounded by a colonnade of timber posts bearing the roof, which could be in clay tiles, though the PCC has expressed an openness to other materials, such as slate or shingles. Associated landscaping comprising planting schemes and cruciform paths with some benches, all designed to encourage outdoor contemplation and reflection, is also proposed.

Initially polycarbonate coloured glazing panels had been proposed for the inner wall but the ACBO explained to the parish that, as an inferior material, it would age poorly and become opaque over time. The committee agreed that coloured toughened glass (or even double glazing with coloured transfer sheets) would be infinitely preferable. The DAC commented that careful consideration would need to be given to both windbracing, and the roofing material since the weight of clay tiles could be an issue. Finally, the committee suggested that as the soil quality may struggle to sustain planting owing to the quantity of rubble therein, raised beds might be a more sensible solution than ground beds. The committee also discouraged the planting of trees as there was a concern that when mature they might disturb archaeology and that they would present a maintenance burden in preventing them from becoming too big.

The DAC was very supportive of this commendable application and was content to delegate the agreement of construction details to a subcommittee, at which point a recommend NOA could be issued without needing to return to the full committee. The Local Planning Authority is to be consulted.

September 2020 minute:

As before, the DAC committee is supportive of the principle of the proposals – the structure will help to provide a focal point for the new landscaping proposals; a shelter and place of contemplation for those tending to graves in the churchyard; and bring attention to the presence of the church congregation in the village. It was noted that there is a very good relationship between the church and the community in Akeley, which we hope this project would only help to encourage.

However, beyond this level of agreement in principle, the committee continues to run up against the uncertainty about what / who / when the structure is for, which makes it difficult to determine whether the current proposals represent the best way of achieving this. There was also a question whether, if the community and church relationship continues to expand, something more substantial would be desirable in the future.

A number of queries with regards to the design of the building were raised in the meeting, such as how the structure will avoid birds striking the glazing, condensation occurring on the glass, damage due to vandalism, becoming too hot in summer and too cold in winter without heating; whether lighting would be required and the whether the amount of glazing poses an unacceptable maintenance liability on the parish etc. It was also not clear where the structure would sit liturgically – whether it would become a chapel of ease for example. It is believed that the Bishop would be able to issue a letter to allow for the structure to be used for certain worship purposes if that would be desired in the future.

The layout and plans for the planting and pathways from the entrance and through the nave area were considered acceptable, subject to construction details being agreed in due course.

It is believed that the heart of the proposal from the Parish is for a structure which will act as a shelter in the churchyard. It seems unfortunate that the pursuit of planning permission from the local authority who asked for a more exceptional design has steered the Parish down a route which is starting to move away from this initial goal, towards something more substantial. The committee therefore suggested that a dialogue with the local authority is set up in order to discuss where there may be flexibility in the approach they have approved.

The DAC resolved to support the application in principle and defer to a subcommittee (Julian and Derek) to resolve the two main questions in order to get to the Notification of Advice stage:

What/who/when is the structure for?

How is that to be best achieved?

September 2021 minute:

The DAC remain supportive of the principle of the proposals and are pleased to the see the parish pressing forward with an ambitious plan to meet the need for a spiritual centre in the village. It is clear that the wider community are supportive of the proposals and interested in having a role in their realisation. The subcommittee were impressed by the presentation from the capable and enthusiastic project team at the delegation site visit. It is encouraging to see the suggestions made at the visit taken on board by the team. Specifically, the proposal to increase the size of the proposed structure and to introduce low stone walls as modesty screens as well as appointment of a Mechanical and Electrical consultant were all felt to be positive steps in the right direction. The parish are encouraged to consider what furnishings/fittings they will need

such as an altar, a font (where is the original font?), storage, chairs etc and how these will fit withing the proposed structure.

Context

The current pews were installed by subscription from 1967 through to the early 70s, replacing wooden chairs which had been *in situ* since before the 1920s. Six of these chairs are proposed to be kept for posterity. The pews, with oak ends, seats and top rails, and veneered back panels, were designed by William West of High Wycombe, though no more is known about him.

The church holds several regular events and services each week, for which some (or many) pews are required to be moved to cater for greater flexibility of use, and free up space. These include the thriving weekly Teeny Saints pre-school group in the north aisle, choir practice in the south aisle, the contemporary Sunday service which attracts 100+ congregants regularly, and other events, such as Alpha courses and exhibitions. The presence of pews is largely at odds with the worship style of this church, and, as well as the difficulty of moving unused pews, the need to store them elsewhere in the church also takes up space, further limiting the use of the nave and aisles.

A DAC delegation visited in July and considered that a sufficiently robust case has been made for the phased, total removal of the pews. The precedence of chairs also weighs in the parish's favour. Because of the level of activity going on in the church, it has a somewhat cluttered feel and appearance, since there are almost always unused pews being stored somewhere or other. The clearance of the pews and comparatively easy and compact storage of stacking wooden, metal-framed chairs, will help to rationalise and enhance the dignity of the space. The delegation was able to see the proposed chairs (which will match some the parish already has) and considered them to be attractive, practical, and good quality.

The pews would be found new homes by sale or recycling, and the kneelers will be offered to the congregation (should any donors/family of donors want theirs back) in the first instance. Remaining kneelers will be offered to other churches or sent for reclamation of materials or disposal.

The delegation also viewed the early 20th century altar proposed for disposal by donation to another church or by burning (under Canon Law), and considered it to be solidly built but unremarkable. As it is sitting redundant behind the modern altar at the east end of the north aisle and does not match any of the other sacramental furniture there, the delegation considered its disposal to be acceptable. The retention of a pew end with the remaining donor plaques on it, mounted on the narthex wall for posterity is a nice idea, though the parish may wish to consider some accompanying contextual interpretation.

Points for Consideration:

- The acceptability of the proposed total removal of the pews and associated frontals in two phases, given their limited significance and the precedent for chairs
- The replacement ICON 40 chairs, in a light oak finish
- The method for disposal of the redundant former Prayer Chapel altar, which is so far unconfirmed
- The acceptability of the design for the commemorative pew end with donor plaques and its proposed location in the narthex

RECOMMENDATION:

The CBO recommends that the DAC issues a "recommend" Notification of Advice, subject to the comments of
the relevant amenity societies, and subject to a photographic record being made of the items for disposal.

The committee resolved to issue a *Recommend* Notification of Advice subject to the following provisos:

- A watching brief to be provided for investigation and recording any buried archaeology revealed during
 the excavation of the new foul drainage. The advice of the Diocesan Archaeological Adviser should be
 observed with regard to the discovery of human remains and significant archaeological deposits. No spoil
 is to leave the churchyard and any charnel must be reburied with due reverence.
- Details of disposal of the altar frontals chest and any altar frontals to be provided prior determination of the application. A separate faculty is required for provision of any new altar frontals.
- Resolution of details to be delegated to a DAC subcommittee.
- That the guidelines on electrical installations at https://www.oxford.anglican.org/wp-content/uploads/2018/05/Electrical-guidelines-DAC-guidance-note-April-2018.pdf are followed.
- That any fixings are non-ferrous and are made into mortar joints or into plain plaster.
- The PCC should be aware that it may have responsibilities for health and safety during these works under the Construction Design Management Regulations 2015. September 2021 minute:

The committee resolved to issue a *Recommend* Notification of Advice subject to the following provisos:

- The diocesan archaeological adviser is to be notified of any buried archaeology revealed when the area of pew platform is excavated to form the new tiled floor. An allowance should be made in the contract for archaeological investigation and recording as required.
- The advice of the DAC is to be sought if it is found that the medieval tiles continue under the areas of the existing pew platforms which are being removed.
- Given the presence of pre-19thC pews in the nave, any future requests for pew removal will need to be considered on a case-by-case basis.
- The DAC recommends that the parish consider replacing the folding chairs with a more appropriate lightweight wooden stacking chair in accordance with CBC guidance when funds are available.

The DAC resolved to endorse the draft report with revisions. The principle of the pew removal, seating introduction, porch alterations, heating and AV systems, alteration to north transept, lady chapel and servery were all supported. It was felt there was insufficient justification for the proposals affecting the chancel furniture and insufficient understanding of the historical and theological significance of the chancel for decisions to be made on these elements of the scheme.

Context

This application is part of a broader scheme to overhaul the heating, following the current high-level radiant heaters being condemned, and to carry out floor repairs, whilst lowering the existing Nave pew platforms and improving ventilation, since the church suffers from damp. The heating and floor works are being dealt with by sub-committee, so it isn't intended to discuss these aspects of the project beyond their effect on the partial pew removal and replacement furniture, for which the whole committee's feedback is sought. The PCC proposes to remove all but eight pews, leaving the remainder in the east end of the nave. These would be unfixed, but will have modern tubular pew heaters attached to them, which could each be plugged into floor-mounted sockets, and moved as and when necessary.

The church, which has a raised west end dais and WC/kitchenette installed ten years ago in the tower, is fairly small and narrow, consisting of chancel, nave and west tower. Yet it is the largest public building in the village (The village "Hut" is essentially just that, and so can only offer limited community use). As well as the traditional services, two weekly cafes were set up pre-COVID-19, and are being re-established. There has been an influx of younger families to the village, but currently there isn't a parents and toddlers group, and there has been an expression of interest from local parents in setting one up in the church. It is considered that the proposed form of heating -electric wall panel heaters mounted at low level with supplementary pew heaters and a curtain heater

above the north door- will be sufficient for the uses the church is planning, but will obviate the ability to store spare pews against the walls of the church at the west end.

The delegation was of the view that the Victorian pitch pine pews have limited significance, which lies more in their local historic connection, being designed by a previous curate, Arthur Bros, and built by a local firm, Brazells, in 1877. Thirteen are fixed on a raised platform either side of the aisle and seven are already free-standing. One of these has been shortened. While the delegation had some initial concerns about the loss of the pews to the chancel, it was clear that the current pews freestanding and currently look quite cluttered with the chairs arranged in an *ad hoc* fashion. The Theo chorus chair is proposed to replace the pews, though the exact number and finish is yet to be finalised, to be agreed by the subcommittee. The delegation recommended that a finish sympathetic to the tones of the existing woodwork in the church would be suitable. It was understood that, when not in use, the chairs are proposed to be stacked behind the arch in the chancel. While there is space behind the chancel arch which is not visible from the nave, this proposal could make the chancel into a storage area, which would be best avoided.

Concerning storage, a shallow cupboard is proposed to be installed on south wall at the west end to replace the book storage currently provided by the shelves built into the backs of the two westernmost pews. But the delegation urged the parish to have a storage audit of everything that currently needs to be stored, and to provide even more storage than is currently need. This will stand them in good stead if the use of the church is to grow in the way it is anticipated, particularly with catering for children more, since things like toddler groups require a deal of equipment.

It had initially been proposed by the parish to curtain off the chancel so that when the church is being used for community events, the most sacred part of the building is screened off. The delegation felt that this was unnecessary and a shame, and furthermore, the presence of four wall monuments mounted above the chancel arch render the installation of a curtail pole virtually impossible, and highly inadvisable, particularly since part of the pediment on the southernmost memorial fell spontaneously fairly recently. The delegation recommended that this, together with a box tomb in parlous condition in the churchyard, needs investigation and conservation.

Points for consideration

- The limited significance of the pews proposed for removal
- If removal is considered acceptable, whether the committee would prefer a) to issue a proviso that the church architect supervise the disposal of the 12 pews in poorest condition, or b) for disposal to be conditional upon the sub-committee supervising agreement for disposal of the 12 worst pews.
- The suitability of the replacement chairs
- The provision for storage furniture, and whether augmentation of these proposals can be dealt with by subcommittee.

Recommendation

The CBO recommends that the committee issues a "Recommend" NOA, subject to the comments of the amenity societies, and subject to provisos relating to the overseeing of the choice of the 12 worst pews, plus details of any additional storage furniture being agreed with the subcommittee.

Subject to the outcome of the site visit at the end of September, the DAC resolved to support the principle of the proposals with resolution of details delegated to a subcommittee. The following details would be required prior to an NOA being issued:

- Specification and schedules of work including proposed materials and finishes,
- Detail design for the glazed inner doors and storage cupboards,
- Archaeological mitigation for installation of concrete pads to support steel frame,
- Details of any items to be relocated and where they will be relocated to,
- Condition report and specification for repairs to west window,
- Details of rationalisation of electrical installation, and
- The purpose of boxing in the top of the stair to the ringing floor as it would intrude on views to the west window. A door from the meeting room into the stair should be sufficient to isolate the two spaces.
