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Welcome

Welcome to 'Equipping for Life'. You will find here a range of courses designed to help you grow in your faith, discipleship and understanding, to become further equipped to serve God in everyday life at work, at home and through church.

Who are these courses for?

Offered by the Diocese of Oxford as part of its Local Ministry Programme (LMP), these courses are for those training as Licensed Lay Ministers (LLMs) or for ordination, and also a growing number of people with a passion to learn more about their faith, about God and our place in his world. Perhaps you want to explore something new, dig a bit deeper into what you believe and why, or reflect on how to be a Christian in your daily life? Simply select your course and sign up.

What level? Will I cope?

You don't need qualifications or prior experience to get the most from these courses. While we provide a more structured learning environment than is possible in a local church, sessions are pitched at a level within the grasp of most adult learners. Level 4 courses are introductory (i.e. equivalent to the first year of university) and assume no prior knowledge. Level 5 is more 'intermediate' and assumes prior learning or experience at Level 4. Saturday courses often cover more practical areas of ministry and can be good taster sessions for other courses.

How does it work? Is there any homework?

Courses are typically delivered through online structured learning materials, weekly group tutorials and in-person study days. Each weekly session will assume up to four hours' preparation. We understand that life can be more busy some weeks than others, but you will find it helpful to keep up most weeks.



Will I need to do any assignments?

While assessed work is compulsory for ordinands and LLMs in training, there is no pressure for 'interested learners' to do marked assignments. However, that option is available if you want it; a number of people do find this helpful.

Validation and awards

Our evening courses are delivered as part of the national Common Awards programme validated by Durham University. Should you wish to register for a formal award - the Foundation Award (three full modules) or Certificate of Higher Education in Theology, Mission and Ministry (six full modules) - please ask for an application form and details of Durham's admission criteria. Early applications are encouraged.

How many courses can I do?


As many as you like! Some people just do particular courses which take their fancy; others come along for one and then just keep going. Why not give it a go, dip a toe in the water and see how you get on?

Christian discipleship

(Level 4: Introductory)



WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO LIVE AS A CHRISTIAN

TODAY? How can we grow in our faith, navigate the questions of life and enable others as followers of Jesus? This course aims to help us review and deepen our understanding and experience of Christian living, to think through our approach to faith and how we respond to the call of God in everyday life. Drawing on the Bible, Christian tradition and contemporary experience, it will explore different approaches to growing in Christ, ethical living and the outworking of our faith in mission and service.

The course will be delivered through structured online learning materials each week (work through these at your own pace), an in-person Study Day

(Saturday 11 June), and eight online group tutorials. Learning materials (videos, guided reading and online tasks) for week 1 will go live on **Monday 18 April**. You will work through these materials at your own pace, in time for your first group tutorial on either Wednesday 27 or Thursday 28 April. Learning materials for subsequent weeks will be released at 9am each Friday, for you to work through ahead of each tutorial.

Bookings close on Monday 18 April (6pm) in order for tutorial groups to be allocated ahead of the first tutorials (indicate your preferences by this time on our Moodle VLE). Late bookings may be possible, though tutorial group choices will be more limited.

Old Testament in context

(Level 5: Intermediate)



THIS COURSE AIMS TO DEEPEN
UNDERSTANDING OF THE OLD TESTAMENT
AND HOW WE MIGHT BEST ENGAGE WITH IT AS
CHRISTIANS TODAY. Areas of focus will include the
Psalms and the book of Job, as well as a selection of
other particularly challenging passages in the Old
Testament canon. We will explore how we might
study the Old Testament and use it in contexts such
as prayer, preaching and small groups. The course
assumes a level of prior introductory learning and is
designed for those who have already attended an
Introduction to the Bible course or similar.

The course will be delivered through structured online learning materials each week (work through

these at your own pace), an in-person Study Day (Saturday 14 May), and eight online group tutorials. Learning materials (videos, guided reading and online tasks) for week 1 will go live by **Monday 4 April**. You will then work through these materials at your own pace, in time for your first group tutorial on Wednesday 20 April. Learning materials for future weeks will be released each subsequent week, for you to work through ahead of the relevant tutorial.
