Priest: The Almighty and merciful Lord grant unto you pardon and







- 21 Do I not hate them, O Lord, that hate thee: and am I not grieved with those that rise up against thee?
- 22 Yea, I hate them right sore:
 even as though they were mine en^emies.
- 23 Try me, O God, and seek the ground of my heart:
 Prove me, and ex-am-ine my thoughts.
- 24 Look well if there be any way of wickedness in *me*:

 And lead me in the way ev-erlasting.

Minister: Come with the dawning of the day,


All: And make thyself known in the breaking of bread.




