What financial support is available for parishes for net zero carbon 2026 -2028

Caring for God's creation is an expression of our Christian faith and mission, and a core aspect of loving God and our neighbours.

We understand that churches are facing a number of funding priorities and much of the practical burden falls on volunteers, clergy and churchwardens to care for church buildings. We thank you for the time and care you bring to this work. With this in mind, the following is intended to highlight the support available to you.

Find out what support your church or hall could apply for over the next three years as we work towards creating warmer, more welcoming churches fit for the future. Grant streams will be going live at various points throughout 2026.

Conditions of application

Your Church of England building should show a genuine commitment to progressing its decarbonisation journey – which means reducing energy use and electrifying heating. This should include being registered for EcoChurch and have completed an EFT (Energy Footprint Tool). Projects must show good value for money and reasonable carbon savings for the cost of the project. You will also need Diocesan support and there will be more information on how to show this further into the application process.

The following support is available for all churches to apply for

The funds are open year-round, with annual funding rounds to manage applications. There will be multiple in-year funding rounds, so you can apply when your project is ready.

Additional funding support for high use buildings

The following funding is available if your building is classified as a high carbon emitter. Well-used community hubs or missionally active spaces whose regular worship, events, and outreach mean higher-than-average energy use; typically, >10 tonnes CO₂/year gross use, based on the EFT. Or, you have received or been invited to apply for the Church Demonstrator Grant.

This is flexible funding designed to meet parishes where they are and to support them at each stage of their journey. Parishes can apply for funding in stages, up to a maximum amount within the overall funding period (for example, £5,000 at a time, up to £15,000 in total).

Notes

- Grants are unlikely to cover the full cost of most projects – consider fundraising or combining funding.
- Grants are nationally available and reviewed regularly to ensure fair distribution across dioceses.
- Maximums in the table above are per building, within the funding period 26 – 28. You can apply for maximum amounts within the time period.
