elcome to this Cathedral Church, and to this annual service for Licensed Lay Ministers, which includes the Admission and Licensing of new Church of England Readers.

Please pray for all those to be admitted and licensed, for their families and all who love and support them, and for their parishes and the people they will serve.

A list of those being licensed is found towards the back of this order of service. The president is the Rt Revd Gavin Collins, Bishop of Dorchester and the preacher is Revd Andrew Blyth, the Director of Mission and Ministry.

The admission and licensing take place in the context of Holy Communion. If you normally receive Communion in your own church, you are most welcome to receive it here.

Those wanting gluten-free wafers should come to the dedicated station in front of the High Altar at the east end of the Cathedral.

All others are most warmly invited to come forward at the same time to receive a blessing.

Please bring this order of service with you so that the ministers know that you want a blessing.

There is a LOOP system for the hard of hearing, which is most effective in the centre of the Cathedral away from the pillars.

A large print version of this service booklet is available. Please feel free to sit at any point during the service.

This is a public occasion. Please be aware that photography will take place during the service, and that the service is being relayed around the building on the TV screens, and livestreamed. No other photography or filming is permitted during the service.

THE LICENSING

The Congregation sits. The Candidates move to where the Bishop is standing, and stand around him with the Warden of Readers and LLM Archdeaconry Advisors. The Bishop says:

In order that we may be satisfied that you are ready to begin the ministry of a Licensed Lay Minister, you must now answer the questions we put to you.

Do you believe that God has called you to this Ministry?

Candidates:

I do so believe.

Bishop:

Will you be faithful in leading the people of God in worship, and in preaching the Word of God to them?

Candidates:

By the grace of God I will.

Bishop:

Will you be diligent in prayer, in reading Holy Scripture, and in all studies that will deepen your faith, and fit you to bear witness to the truth of the Gospel?

Candidates:

By the grace of God I will.

Bishop:

Will you endeavour to fashion your life according to the way of Christ?

Candidates:

By the grace of God I will.



The Bishop presents the Candidates to the people and says:

Bishop:

Brothers and sisters,

these men and women

have been chosen for the office of Reader and are to be licensed as Lay Ministers.

Will you uphold and encourage them in their ministry?

All:

We will.

Bishop:

Will you continue to pray for them?

All:

We will.

Bishop:

Eternal God, great in mercy and compassion, who orders the church and the world, look on these your servants called to the ministry of your word, and continually fill them with your Holy Spirit that they might speak your Word, live your truth, and glorify you in and through their lives and ministries; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All:

Amen.

The Warden of Readers and LLM Archdeaconry Advisors lead the Bishop to each Candidate in turn for the Bishop to admit them as Readers and pray for them.

Bishop:

I admit you as a Reader in the Church, and I license you as a Licensed Lay Minister in this Diocese, in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

All:

Amen.



The Archdeaconry Advisors put the scarves on their candidate and give them a Bible. When all Candidates have received these tokens of ministry, the Bishop says:

Bishop:

Receive this Book, as a sign of the authority given to you this day to speak God's word to his people. Build them up in his truth and serve them in his Name.

All:

Amen.

The Bishop then welcomes the Readers into the ministry into which they have been newly licensed.

Bishop:

Eve, Linda, Rachel, Mike, Joe, Karen – welcome to your new ministries! To lead people in worship and break open the Word of God are amongst the greatest privileges this life affords. May the Lord bless you richly in this ministry; give you wisdom, courage, love, and strength to do his will; may he stir up in you the gifts of his grace and sustain each one of you throughout your ministry, for his glory.

Bishop:


We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

If you wish Communion to be brought to you, please speak to a sidesman.



All others are most welcome to come forward to receive a blessing: please bring this order of service with you so that the ministers know that you want a blessing. During Communion the choir will sing, "Beati quorum via" with words from Psalm 119 verse 1 ("Happy are they that are upright in the way, who walk in the law of the Lord") and music by Charles Villiers Stanford. You are invited to join in the hymns.
