# **Towards a Common Vision Small Group Insights**

- Recognise our differences, build on our strengths – demographics, diversity, locality
- Repair the network reconnecting with each other
- Using 3C's as a cycle to build confidence and reduce anxiety

- More intentionality towards schools and also listen to and engage with young people
- Are we budget driven rather than value driven?
- We need to note and affirm the place of those who live on their own

- We're noticing the Spirit at work amongst us and the energy rising and growing
- Where did Jesus go to encounter people? And where would he go today?
- Which of the 3C's most resonates with you? and why?

- We have been equal partners lay and ordained. We have a common purpose and confidence in +Steven – we mustn't lose this.
- Our schools are doing great work, but we're not listening enough to children in other places.
- We're doing creative work and so need to listen to God. We must not be anxious, but capture stories and good practice

- We want to be courageous / radical
- Recognise and release the fire and passion that is already there and what God is already doing
- Communicating the importance and possibilities of church planting / transplanting/pioneering

- Primacy of contemplation
- Need for wisdom, perseverance and patience
- The whole people of God –
  collaboration, clergy letting go, the
  whole people of God

- Culture change must be a priority
- Need to bless bottom-up developments and provide a climate in which new things can grow
- Contemplation must be a foundation on which a counter-cultural focus on 'being' that is highly sustainable rests

- Rework and reimagine language of vocation and ministry – inclusive and empowering for laity and younger people
- Being bold and being radical take risks for success and failure. Anticipating what we will look like in 2025
- We have more in common than things that we might disagree over

- Radical is good is it radical enough?
- We should be intentionally listening to those we don't hear – millennials, children and young people
- Small groups really work!

- The Bishops staff, together with extended group to take responsibility for a shared 'episcope' for being lens through which 3Cs are seen by others
- We need to involve younger leaders (16-30!) more in shared conversations
- Resist temptation to rebrand agendas at Church House depts. – we must rethink who we are and what we do if to become church of the beatitudes

- Happy with 3C's but feeling 6 strategy areas not radical enough
- In response to changes we have heard and our communities needs – let's be honest in communicating challenges, open to risk-taking and engage in listening to people in and out of the church
- Be more intentional about recognising service as a means to speaking into culture

- Dare to dream seek and expect the unexpected
- Common ground, language, shared trust and values in 3C's – relationships matter and challenge 'them' and 'us' attitudes
- How do we do 'death' better? allowing new life to come, pruning the vine and God's economy is very different

- As a Diocese, God has given us all the resources we need. How do we harvest this at every level of Diocese?
- Observing energy generated by George Lings stories of lay leadership
- Impact of +Steven's bible studies not just what he said, but what was modelled. Can't Bishops do this more often?
