A Clergy numbers

The initial clergy numbers used are the final numbers of the previous year. Agreed changes in the number of posts will be reflected in the final stage of the revised share allocation where an immediate change will be made to the deanery share allocation and the final budget. Those currently indicated by archdeacons are reflected in the final columns of the June draft share allocation.

B Housing costs

These are the average costs associated with maintaining a parsonage house, along with council tax, water charges, insurance and alarm systems together with the costs of providing housing allowances and rental costs where necessary.

C Opportunity costs

This arises from the difference between the average cost of a House for Duty house and the value now allocated to the deanery for that post, creating a surplus. The allocation of this back to the deaneries recognises that where a deanery has areas receiving support which are ministered to by a House for Duty incumbent they should not be financially penalised by the additional deanery allocation for that post.

D Vacancies

Vacancy relief is applied as a reduction of the support costs.
